### **ACHIEVEMENTS 2020**

#### 1. Health

## • Distribution of medical material and equipment – Zanzibar

The Asma Mwinyi Foundation

The AMF in Partnership with Helping Hand and Muzdalifa distributed health materials and equipment worth of USD 300,000 in Wete Hospital – Pemba and Makunduchi Hospital – Unguja.

### • Supporting people with special needs

The AMF has distributed five (5) wheelchairs and other equipment to those with special needs in Mkuranga – Pwani Region.

#### • Distribution of sanitary pads.

The AMF participated in the champaign of "Nistiri ubinti wangu" with Priyoafrica by providing sanitary pads to Bethsaida Orphans' Girl Secondary School.

#### 2. Education

# • The construction of six (6) School toilets for pupils with special needs.

The AMF together with the Vikindu community succeeded in contraction of six (6) toilets for Vikindu Primary School for the pupils with special needs.

The School constitutes of sixty-five (65) disabled children of which two (2) girls are albinos, one (1) girl and one (1) boy are blind, one (1) girl and three (3) boys are physically disabled, thirty-seven (37) girls and twenty-two (22) boys are mentally disabled.

#### Water well for Mwarusembe Primary School.

In partnership with Istiqama Oman and the AMF we provided a water well with a tower for Mwarusembe Primary School in Mkuranga, Pwani Region. The school consist of one thousand (1,000) pupils of with 680 girls and 320 boys.

### • Supported pupils with special needs – blinds

We have provided a typewriter (Braille) and walking stick worth of TZS 2.5 million to pupils in Uhuru Mchanganyiko Primary School – Dar es Salaam.

# Access to clean water from the water well

Together AMF and Istiqam – Oman successfully provided access to clean water to the Mwarusembe community. This was successfully achieved after we have built a water well in the communal mosque nearby. The Community have 1,800 people. This helped to resolved the challenge they were facing to have to walk 1.5 kilometres to get water.

#### 3. Social needs

#### Distribution of clothing material

The clothing distribution help villagers and especially girls and women in Tanzania who are unable to afford

adequate clothing. The clothes collected are distributed to needy families in urban/rural areas of Tanzania.

# • Distribution of food and drinks to hospitals, Dar es Salaam

We have donated five-hundred (500) loafs of breads to The Ocean Road Hospital patients and porridge to the Muhimbili National Hospital.

# • Cleaning and renovation of water well, Stone town – Unguja

The AMF have cleaned, renovated a water well and added two concrete drainage pipes in Mji Mkongwe (Stone Town) area. The

# • Completion of water well Vuga – Mikadini, Unguja.

The communal water well as the community did not have enough sufficient funds to compete the drilling of the water well. The AMF through friends and families successfully managed to complete the water well.

• We have taken 15 boys from Yuyata to Assalaam\_foundation to their orphanage centre.

## 4. Spiritual care

• Two water well tower and tanks built in two mosques in Donga – Unguja. This has not only resolved the main challenge they were facing of ablution services to the worshipers but also provided access to clean water to the member of the nearby communities that live there and those who passes by close to the mosque.

## • Two Water well, tower and tank to Mwarusembe Mosque – Mkuranga, Pwani region.

This has not only resolved the main challenge they were facing of ablution services to the worshipers but also provided access to clean water to the member of the nearby communities that live there and those who passes by close to the mosque.

#### • Ifter food packages.

The AMF also engages in the distribution of iftar food packages during the holy month of Ramadan providing for essential items such as rice, beans, cooking oil, flour, spaghetti and dates to families in need such as the orphans, widows, elderly, women and men.

Through the generosity and support of individuals, family and friends and in partnership with other NGOs such as the Al Baraka Foundation, the AMF successfully distributed iftar food packages to two-hundred and thirty-five (235) underprivileged families despite the challenges caused by presence of COVID-19.
